









Family Therapy is a form of treatment that views psychological problems and their treatment in terms of the interactions among family members. Families are seen as an integrated, interconnected unit in which psychological functioning is influenced by each and every family member individually and collectively as an entire system.



Mr.X, a twenty three year old male, was diagnosed with Lymphoma. Initially, the patient's family associated the disease with going to the Gym as the patient did not eat much due to dietary restrictions. So, they scolded him in the OP ward in front of every one.

This upset him to the extent where he began to have suicidal thoughts as he felt helpless because of his parent's attitude. "I am more worried about my parent's ignorance and my career, than the disease". At this point out CCF Staff approached the parents and the patient. CBT, psycho-education along with various interventions was given to the whole family, leading to a better understanding about the illness. The patient has now completed his education and is doing well in his chosen profession. Now, he is still undergoing treatment, but with hope and happiness.

Coimbatore Cancer Foundation and PSG Institute together celebrated 'World Cancer Day' on February 4th, 2022. Our theme for this year is "CLOSETHE CARE GAP." More than fifty participants attended and benefited from the event. The In and Out patients, cancer survivors and their family, PSG nursing students and faculty, staff from the Oncology Department and CCF staff, actively participated to spread cancer awareness.

The events included poster presentation, acting out an awareness skit on how to view cancer positively. It was followed by an Oncologist's speech, a Survivor's speech, and a Q & A session. Two webinars were conducted for two colleges and a video of the public`s view on cancer was taken.

On the same day, our Aravanaippu team made posters which were displayed at PSG Hospitals Karadivavi. This was followed by an awareness speech to the patients and distribution of pamphlets. 


School Awareness Programme
