Her father had passed away during the COVID pandemic and the members of her family thought that her poor appetite was due to her grief over the loss of her Dad. However, there was no improvement in her eating pattern even after six months so they consulted a doctor. It was then that she was diagnosed with cancer. The whole family was aghast. They were unwilling to accept treatment and felt hopeless about her future. At this point our CCF Counsellor stepped in and educated them about the diagnosis and treatment modalities. They agreed to let her undergo treatment.

Now Ms. X is going through the treatment with a very positive frame of mind and shares an aura of hope with other patients as well.



Sand play therapy is a nonverbal, therapeutic intervention that makes use of a sandbox, toy figures, and sometimes water, to create scenes of miniature worlds that reflect a person's inner thoughts, struggles, and concerns.

Sand play is especially well suited for working with young children, who often cannot express their inner feelings in words.
