Ms.Ranjitha is a very creative and talented person. She has completed M. Com and was a beautician before she became a victim of cancer. She had undergone the treatment all alone as she had no support from her brother. The only support she has is few of her friends from the church community. At present she has completed her chemotherapy as well as surgery (Mastectomy). She is recovering well post surgery and is regularly following-up for post-surgery care.

She is very thankful to CCF counselors as they helped her to overcome depression, anxiety and motivated her all through the treatment. CCF also helped her financially for her treatment expenses.

Mrs.Ranjitha is a person who doesn't want to give up no matter how hard the journey is. She is indeed a fighter. She believes that mindset played a vital role throughout her journey.

Success Story...

Mr. X, 84 years old was diagnosed with prostate cancer in 2020 and he underwent surgery immediately. He didn't attend any follow up after the surgery as his symptoms were relieved. The patient was doing fine until few months back when he started experiencing back pain which his family members related to his advancing age and gave him few pain killers which didn't help him. Later they sought consultation at local hospital where he was given some strong painkillers and physiotherapy which again proved unsuccessful.

In the meantime, patient also developed urinary symptoms and neurological symptoms of his both legs. It was at this point, the patient was referred to the Aravanaippu team and on detailed evaluation including basic investigations (to rule out cancer recurrence) was found to have recurrence of his prostate cancer which has spread to his back bone at multiple sites causing him such severe low back pain associated with neurological complaints. The patient was immediately referred to Radiation Oncologist for Palliative Radiotherapy. Now having completed his course of Palliative Radiotherapy, the patient is relieved of all his symptoms. As well as timely detection and intervention of his recurrent disease has prevented the patient from going into complete paralysis of his legs, which would've made him bed bound for the rest of his life.

(Information for all those reading: Any cancer after any sort of treatment could come back anytime for anyone, so it is recommended to attend the follow ups even after successful completion of treatment and to not ignore any symptoms which are persistent and worsening with time).
